Here are some ways you can support the community work of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women Oakland Bay Area Chapter:

- Positive Steps Mentoring and Youth Development—We meet with an average of 35 to 40 young women every month to focus on their personal growth, cultural enrichment and social development
 - \$150—will allow us to purchase healthy food for their lunch. We feed them at the beginning of the meeting to improve their attention and focus
 - \$100—helps cover the cost of printing of the manuals, supplies for eating and/or activities for a meeting
 - \$75—helps supplement the cost of a MCJW Luncheon for either a young lady or a chaperon
 - \$25—purchases a white blouse for the MCJW Luncheon that each Positive Stepper must wear to the event
- Community Engagement—during the summer months as part of our Sistah's Getting Real, we provide the food for eight Community Grill-Outs. Those in the community who get tested to find out their status receive a meal. An average of 35 to 50 people are tested during each Grill-Out.
- Administration Costs—we are an all-volunteer organization but our annual dues do not cover all expenses. We need help with the expenses of running a successful chapter:
 - ✓ Bookkeeper
 - ✓ Storage and Meeting Space
 - ✓ Transcription Services
